GASB 60: Service Concession Arrangements — Introduction

This statement provides guidance to account for and report Service Concession Arrangements (SCAs), a type of public-private or public-public partnership. GASB 60, Paragraph 4, lists all of the following criteria that must be met to be an SCA.

A plain-language summary of this standard can be viewed online.

An SCA is an arrangement between a transferor (a government) and an operator (governmental or nongovernmental entity) where the transferor conveys to the operator the right to provide public services through the use of a facility (either existing or newly constructed infrastructure) or other asset, in exchange for fees from third parties. A governmental agency or institution can be either the transferor or the operator in an SCA.

Assets commonly used in SCAs which generate fees for services include:

- Roads and bridges
- Water and sewer
- Golf courses
- Dormitories
- Parking garages
- Parking meters

Potential SCAs for universities include:

- Auxiliary Organizations
- Bookstores
- Food Service
- Foundations
- Strip Mall
- Libraries
- Parking
- Public Radio
- Sports Complex
- Student Housing
- Student Union

SGA Criteria

All of the following criteria must be met to be an SCA: (GASB 60, paragraph 4)

1. The transferor in an arrangement conveys to an operator the right and related obligation to provide public services through the use and operation of infrastructure or other public asset in exchange for significant consideration (such as an up-front payment, installment payments, a new facility or improvements to an existing facility).
2. The operator collects and is compensated by fees from third parties.
3. The transferor determines, or has the ability to modify or approve:
 - what services the operator must provide
 - to whom the operator must provide services
 - prices or rates the operator can charge for the services
4. The transferor is entitled to significant residual interest in the service utility of the facility at the end of the arrangement.
